His research is focused on ecclesiology in the post-Reformation era.

Prior to serving at All Saints Presbyterian Church, Connor served first as the Assistant Pastor, then Associate Pastor at New Life Presbyterian Church of La Mesa from 2020 to 2025. He also served as the Stated Clerk of the South Coast Presbytery (PCA) from 2023-2025.
